Main themes	Disciplinary themes varying annually will be selected and detailed by the teacher so as to facilitate access to the history and actors of anthropology. Lectures will address major and modern issues in the fields of culture (its grounding, symbolism, time and space perception, identity, objects, myth, magic, ritual and art) of social life (collective institutions and ideologies, man/woman relationships, division of labour, hierarchical stratification, power, rules and regulations, identity, change and reciprocity.

Lectures will be based where required on field experience so as to illustrate how anthropology goes about mak-ing sense of the data collected.
