Content	We will study speech act theory, especially the theories of J. L. Austin and J. R. Searle.				
The topics are: the classification of speech acts, the difference between perfomative and co indirect speech acts. Then we will discuss the theory of conversational implicatures (P. Grice), principle and the conversational maxims and Grices' further developed model of conversational's book "Relevance." Finally, we will look at the role of word and sentence seman pragmatics, for a theory of meaning in language. All topics will pay special attention to spoken is a lecture that requires the student's active participation in discussions, in dealing with exercise scientific texts. Furthermore, every student has to give a short presentation on one of the discussion of the course.
