	<ul> <li>December mark: continuous assessment 50% (plan and insctructions in course notes) and an oral exam 50% in week 14. If the student fails, he can repass the oral exam of the first term in may but not the continuous assessment.Si l'étudiant</li> <li>May mark: continuous assessment 50% (plan and insctructions in course notes) and an oral exam 50% in week 13.</li> <li>Final mark: 50% december mark and 50% may mark.</li> <li>September session: no marks from december or juin or continuous assessment will be considerated. September exam: Vocabulary 30%, grammar 30%, oral exame 40%.</li> </ul>				
Teaching methods	Each topic includes receptive and productive activities aimed at consolidating and broadening vocabulary and grammar. Particular emphasis on grammar points, likely to cause difficulties to French-speaking learners.

Content	The activities based on authentic documents (reading and listening comprehension) concern economic topics and help the student to develop the communicative competences which will be needed in the course of BLOC 3 or in later professional life. Basic vocabulary and structures are trained, reinforced and expanded via written and oral exercises (role-plays, interviews, conversations in small groups of 2 or 4, ')
