Main themes	<p>The course focuses on an introduction to language learning mechanisms and underlying theories. The following will be covered:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - conditioning and reinforcement (behaviourist theories); - comprehensible input (innest theories); - equilibration (constructivist theories); - potential learning sequences (socioconstructivist theories); - routine formats (culturalist theories); - metalinguistic skills (gestalt theories); - long-term memory (cognitive theories).

Content	<p>Part of the course is devoted to the presentation(display) of thean introduction to linguistic acquisition mechanisms of and their reference theories.
