Main themes	The course gives a detailed analysis of European Union rules and case law relating to free movement of workers, citizens, goods, capital, services, including a study of the European policy of approximation of national legislations, as well as an overview on competition rules. The case law of the European Court of Justice plays is commonly used.

Evaluation methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Oral examination.
Teaching methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. The course favours a synthetic approach, while illustrating the concepts through the case-law of the ECJ. The course is taught in the form of lectures. Students have Powerpoint presentations and a case-law compendium at their disposal. - Practical sessions introduce the method of applying internal market rules to practical cases. - Lectures use Powerpoint presentations as well as a collection of documents provided at the beginning of the semester.
Content	The course sets out a synthesis of the legal regime of the internal market. The following items are thus covered: free movement of goods, services, persons (worker & citizen) and capital. The main rules governing the law on competition are also covered. The main emphasis is on analysing primary law on goods and services. The course aims to give students a comprehensive understanding of the mechanisms governing the European Union's substantive law, and a practical insight as well. Competition law (including State aid rules) is also covered in general terms.
