Main themes	The course includes the following topics: 1. Introduction to codicology; 2. Handwritten copy of ancient Greek texts and textual transmission issues; 3. Ancient Greek writings; 4. Practical training in reading ancient Greek manuscripts (reading exercices); 5. Theoretical and practical training in editing ancient Greek texts.		
Aims	At the end of this course, the student will be able: to decipher a ancient Greek manuscript, or to find the necessary assistance to read it; to locate a written text within the history of ancient Greek writings; to read, analyse and use an edition (introduction and critical apparatus); to collate various major manuscripts of a given text and to prepare a provisional edition; to use bibliographical and working tools. 		
Evaluation methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Oral exam will focus on: reading exercises, theoretical presentations, some articles to complete or clarify the theoretical data.		
Teaching methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. Lectures (theoretical presentations) are completed with practical exercises (reading and editing).		
Content	Among the years, the course may be more specifically devoted to a particular category of texts or to a particular type of writing, but the basis of the course always focuses on the most important book writings.		
Inline resources	The documents (bibliography, theoretical elements, documentation) will be progressively accessible on the Moodle space of the course.
