Methodological and basic technological notions in four structured sections: general and historical concepts, art history, archaeological aspects and engineering. The course aims to allow students from different educational backgrounds to reach the same level of competence. Essential conceptual notions to be considered in heritage matters and presentation of current conservation-restoration issues.
