This essay will mobilize scientific literature, but also online or digital resources (e.g. building Twitter lists of key contributors on a specific topic). The use of social networks (Twitter, YouTube...) will be part of the evaluation and the final grade.</p>
Teaching methods	<p>Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change.</p> <p>The class organization will include some sessions (lectures in French) introducing each of the themes and specific issues. Other weeks of the semester will be spent using social media, using online resources and writing the essay for the final evaluation.</p>
Content	<p>Knowledge: An analysis of the implications of digital technologies on contemporary politics.</p> <p>Skills: to be able to use social networks (a.o. Twitter), to be able to implement models and theories of political science to a case of application in relation with digital technologies.</p>
