Main themes	This course focuses on the relationship between the referential Text of Islam in its two variations (Quran and Hadith) and on the different historical contexts which has conditioned it. The course studies the relationship between the two scriptural sources and then delves into the resulting evolutions of Islamic sciences, in relation to essential themes and questions which have animated the debates of Muslim thinkers.
Aims	- mastered the basics of the foundations of Muslim religious learning: its referential sources and their origins, their natures, values and scopes; - understood the production of religious knowledge and its evolutions: the emergence and methodologies of various Islamic sciences and their interrelationships; - evaluated the development and modes of production of Muslim thought in light of historical discoveries and contemporary contexts.
