Evaluation methods These modalities are subject to modification depending on the sanitary measures in place. 1. At the beginning of the year, the students take a compulsory exemption test of the same level as the final exam. This test is NOT available to BLOC1 students who have not validated the first 45 credits. The test is NOT available to students who failed the BLOC 1 English course (LANGL1841). partial exam (50%) • written exam (30%) on grammar, vocabulary, texts and videos/audios seen in Q1 + unseen material • Multitest (10%) academic vocabulary: self-tuition exercises are available on Moodle. Multitest will be tested as part of the written exam. • oral exam (10%) testing general and specific vocabulary pronunciation and reading aloud part of a script taken from a video/audio seen in class and an extract from a prepared article. The oral exam will be organized during the January session, by appointment with the teacher. Students must take both parts of the exam (written and oral). If students are absent for the written or oral part, they will be considered as "absent" for the whole partial exam. IMPORTANT: The mark displayed on the virtual desktop in January is the sum of the written and oral parts of the partial exam. It is this total mark that counts. If the student gets less than 10/20 at the partial exam, he/she will have to resit the exam (written + oral) during the June session (in addition to Q2 material, see below). It is not possible to postpone the partial exam to August/September. 1. Q2 (50%) • written exam (30%) on grammar, vocabulary, texts and videos seen in Q2 + unseen material • progress bar (10%) work done on the Moodle platform during the whole year (term 1 and term 2) • Research article talk (10%): in groups, during the year (term 1 and term 2): find a scientific article tackling a topic of your choice, which should be related to psychology or speech and language therapy (for ex. by using Libellule: https://bib.uclouvain.be/opac/ucl/), create a vocabulary file with the 10 most important words or expressions and present the content of the article orally. 4. August/September exam • Students will have to resit the whole exam (Q1 + Q2 material), including multitest vocabulary and oral exam. Breakdown of the marks: written: 80% oral: 20% Students must take both parts of the exam (written and oral). If students are absent for the written or oral part, they will be considered as "absent" for the whole exam. This course of English for Psychologists is aimed at improving reading and listening comprehension skills and is Content based on authentic material oriented towards the students' fields of interest (psychology, educational science and speech therapy); it is also aimed at giving the students a better mastery of the linguistic code of English through systematic grammatical and pronunciation exercises as well as developing the students' general, specific and academic vocabulary. Evaluation methods	Following the PSP faculty's decision, the LANGL1842 partial exam will take place remotely.
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The new modalities are listed below:

### Oral exam on TEAMS (appointment with your teacher, January session). No preparation time

- PRONUNCIATION (10%):
- 1. Read 20 words (general English, Répétiteur)
- 2. Read 10 words (specific English, Répétiteur)
- 3. Read an extract from audio/video material seen in term 1 (scripts and audio/video material available on Moodle)
- 4. Read one of the 5 texts you have to prepare in advance (available on Moodle in the "oral exams" section)
- VOCABULARY (5%):

You will have to make 5 sentences based on 5 words randomly selected from the vocabulary lists of the syllabus (texts and audio-video material from term 1)

• GRAMMAR (5%):

You will have to conjugate 5 verbs (sentences with gaps, you will have to use the correct tense according to the context)

#### Written exam on MOODLE (please check ADE for date and time)

• READING COMPREHENSION (10%):

MCQ questions on passages from seen (term 1) and unseen texts

• LISTENING COMPREHENSION (10%):

MCQ and open questions on seen (term 1) and unseen audio/video material

The MULTITEST will be tested during the June exam.

Reminder: both exams (written and oral) have to be taken. If the student is absent for the written or oral exam, he/ she will be considered absent for the whole partial exam.

IMPORTANT: the mark on the virtual office in January is the sum of the written and oral partial exams. Students who got less than 10/20 will have to resit both parts of the partial exam (written AND oral) during the June exam (this cannot be directly postponed to the August/September session).

#### Weighting of term 2 assessment: 60%

- written exam (30%) grammar, vocabulary, texts and videos seen in term 2 + unseen material to test listening and reading comprehension skills.

Multitest (10%)

- progress bar (10%): activities on Moodle
- Research article talk (10%): in groups, throughout the academic year (term 1 and 2): find a scientific article about a topic of your choice, related to the field of psychology or speech and language therapy (for example via the library system: <a href="https://bib.uclouvain.be/opac/ucl/">https://bib.uclouvain.be/opac/ucl/</a>), create a vocabulary list with the 10 most important terms of the article and present the content of the article orally.
