Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Main themes	In-depth study of the Hittite language. Alternating with LGLOR2612, this course of 22,5 hours deals with texts of varied content (historic, religious, etc.) in Hittite dating essentially from the second millennium BC. To this course are added 7,5 hours of exercices which correspond to the personal preparation of a Hittite text.

Teaching methods	Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the information in this section is particularly likely to change. The selected texts are prepared by the students and the translations are discussed during the course, in order to reach a valid translation and a good understanding of the text.
Content	The course enables the student to deepen and widen his knowledge and experiences acquired at bachelor level. According to the year, the texts studied, for example, are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - extracts of Hittite epics or myths (the Telepinu myth); - Hittite rituals; - Hittite treaties and edicts.
