Main themes	<p>In-depth study of the language and texts of New Kingdom Egypt.                      Alternately with LGLOR2625, this course deals with the following themes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. An initiation into Late Egyptian and the translation, with commentaries, of a text (15 hours lectures);</li> <li>2. Personal translation of an epigraphic text from the XVIIIth Dynasty (10 hours exercises);</li> <li>3. An initiation into hieratic writing (5 hours exercises).</li> </ol>
Learning outcomes	<p>1 At the end of this course the student will be capable to read, transliterate and translate easily epigraphic and literary texts from the New Kingdom.
