Prerequisites	The prerequisite(s) for this Teaching Unit (Unité d'enseignement – UE) for the programmes/courses that offer this Teaching Un are specified at the end of this sheet.					
Learning outcomes	At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :   The aim of this course in Bloc 3 is to push the students forward to an "Independent" level (B2+) or an Advance level (C1-).   The interactive courses as well as the home assignments will help the student be competent with the language at a lexical level but also with different skills: emphasis will be put on speaking (professional group presentation and understanding spoken English (mainly) as well as writing (reading specialised articles).					
Evaluation methods	It is important to highlight that this course is based on continuous assessment throughout the term: class participation is of upmost importance. The home assignments required by the teacher must be done thoroughly. They are part of the final evaluation. There is no exam in January nor in June. The final grade is based on different oral and written tests, as well as continuous assessment organised during the term.					
	Oral part: 10 points					
	It is important to note that the students need to be active during the interactive courses. Class participation discussion and debate activities, knowledge of the vocabulary, mastery of the oral exercises, etc., are assessed during the term (/6).					
	The oral presentation (in groups) is an important part of the oral evaluation (/4) as well.					
	Written part: 10 points					
	Vocabulary and content of the 4 topics of the presentations and the topics seen in class (The languag of presentations, How to use visuals, Describing graphs & trends, Speed Networking), advanced gramma (connectives), listening comprehension and writing (key words and vocabulary specific to the topic + writing a essay on one the 4 topics of the presentations + writing a report). Regarding the written report, the teacher require the student to analyse a TED Talk video (student's choice) in terms of content and public speaking skills.					
	Evaluation is based on the written exam which takes place at the beginning of December (/7) (exam off session and the written report (/3).					
	If the student does not submit the written report, the grade for this part of the course will be 0A. Furthermore, the global grade shall be 0/20 (NP). The same conditions apply for the written exam (and for the oral exam).					
	By the end of the term, the students receive a grade for the whole term, based on the aforementione distribution. The course is passed with a grade of 10/20 or higher for the full year.					
	Catch-up exam organised in September: same grade weight but continuous assessment marks are no longer taken into account. The catch-up exams in the September session (both written and oral) also include the writter report and the presentation. The student must present one of the topics of the course (individually) for 10 minuted during the oral exam and also answer questions on the course content. There is also a written exam. The student will also have to submit the written report (cf. above).					
	Use of generative artificial intelligence (or any other online tool, e.g. translators, spelling and gramma checkers,)					
	If the student chooses to use one or more Als (or any other online tool), they must systematically indicate a the parts in which these tools were used, e.g. in footnotes. The student should specify whether the Al was use to search for information, to write the text, or to improve or correct it. The student should also mention which Al (or other online tool) was used (ChatGPT, Bing, Bard, Chatsonic, DeepL, etc.) and the date on which it was used. Information sources must be systematically cited in accordance with bibliographic referencing standards.
