Learning outcomes	At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to : The aim of this course is to introduce the students to the great thinkers and to the major topics of the history of philosophy, by means of specific philosophical issues.

Teaching methods	This course is based on lectures about a philosopher or a philosophical topic, and on related readings. The course will thus switch between general lectures and precise and closed readings.
Content	The first part of the course will be dedicated to the philosophy of history of Walter Benjamin. The second half will be dedicated to the genealogical method of Michel Foucault.
