Evaluation methods	Oral examination in two parts
Teaching methods	The course is taught by the professor, however, students are encouraged to take an active part in the lessons through their preparatory or complementary readings.
Content	<p>The course is composed of a first part devoted to the acquisition of theoretical tools for narrative texts (Joëlle Lints); it mainly addresses the concepts and tools of an internal approach of the narrative text: the narration (perspectives, narrators and narrative levels, transposition of speech), the diegetic world (plot, characters, chronotope), the narrative text (writing, form...)</p> <p>The second part (Isabelle Ost) puts into question some key concepts of literary theory, such as the aesthetics, the genre, the discourse, etc., before proposing a reflection on the dialogue between the different analysis procedures of literary texts.</p>
