Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Prerequisites	LGLOR1721 et LGLOR1722, or equivalent level
Main themes	In-depth and interactive analysis of a selection of representative works of classical Greek, Hellenistic or Roman literature, according to a given theme.
Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1 translate into literary French representative texts from classical Greek, Hellenistic or Roman literature; 2 produce an argumentative commentary on one or more works of Greek literature, including literary, historical, stylistic and cultural considerations; 3 conduct personal research as an extension of the course.
Evaluation methods	Oral exam covering: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the texts studied during the course; - the oral presentation of the personal commentary prepared by the student.
Teaching methods	The translations prepared by the students will be corrected during the course, and will be the subject of the widest possible commentary. The use of several editions will highlight the problems of establishing the text.
Content	The authors chosen for the course are the poets Callimachus and Theocritus. After an introduction setting the author and his work in their context, the translation will be the subject of a methodical commentary. The students will be required to prepare a brief personal commentary of the authors and texts studied during the course, which they will present orally during the exam.
