Evaluation methods	In this course, students are assessed in two ways: - continuous assessment, including 2 compulsory homeworks due no later than the first day of the session in January or August. Each homework is worth 3 points out of 20 in the final grade (6 points out of 20 in total). - an in-session oral examination worth 14 points out of 20 of the final grade.
