Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <p>This course specifically aims at developing students' skills of observation and analysis of parent-child relationships within the family. Evaluation methods	<p>In this course, students are assessed in two ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - continuous assessment, including 2 compulsory homeworks due no later than the first day of the session in January or August. Each homework is worth 3 points out of 20 in the final grade (6 points out of 20 in total). - an in-session oral examination worth 14 points out of 20 of the final grade.
