| Learning outcomes | <p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To be able to read, understand and summarise articles on Italian linguistics; - To be able to recognise and analyse basic linguistic phenomena which are not included at all in Italian normative grammar, or only to a limited extent; ¹ - To be able to understand and apply these phenomena; - To be able to discuss and make a presentation; - To be able to write an essay. |
| Evaluation methods | <p>First session :</p> <p>ongoing examination. The students are required to hand a research paper within the first 10 weeks of the semester which will be assessed before the end of the term. The students will then orally present the results of their research. 10 out of 20 are required to access the written examinations.</p> <p>Lecture [50%]:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • written exam during the examination sessions on the contents of the lecture • Research paper and oral presentation <p>TP [50%]:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • continuous assessment of Italian normative grammar during the semester (lesson & grammar) <p>Second session:</p> <p>Lecture [50%]</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • written exam during the examination session • research paper and oral presentation of the research paper <p>TP[50%]</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • written assessment of Italian normative grammar. |
| Teaching methods | Seminar classes Practical sessions: exercises |
| Content | <p>The course offers an introduction to the characteristics of modern Italian. In particular, the differences between the standard language and so-called neo-standard, which is in the process of establishing itself, will be analysed. We will cover the freedom of word order in Italian as well as new developments in modes, in the use of verb tenses and in the sequence of tenses.</p> <p>In the practicals we will review standard grammar, especially verb forms of regular and irregular verbs, verb valency, and the sequence of tenses in standard Italian</p> |
