Teaching methods	Lectures, with an active participation of the students. Courses will be taught in English.
Content	The seminar will address the major values and international issues relating to development aid interventions in the countries of the Global South. It will address three main themes: current debates on the universality of human rights and common goods; the place of health in the global management of international affairs by the UN, its programmes and agencies, and other international organisations; and the integration of a global approach to development aid in contexts and states described as fragile, in response to the requirements of development aid effectiveness (Paris Declaration, 2005). Each of these 3 areas will be addressed on the basis of one or more case studies, in order to ground the lessons in the reality of a field close to the working conditions of the participants.
