Main themes	This course offers an introduction to the first phase of English literary history (from ca 650 to ca 1850). It summarizes the most important genres, writers, and developments, and places them in their literary and historical context. As part of this course, students are also expected to read a selection of texts and excerpts from across this period. A series of workshops will be organised to help students read and understand these texts.
