Prerequisites	Completion of an introductory course in linguistics and of a course on the phenomena of variation in contemporary French.
Main themes	This course covers the objects, concepts and methods of sociolinguistics. It will provide an overview of the major approaches in this discipline (e.g. variationism, interactional sociolinguistics, studies of language ideologies, critical sociolinguistics), highlighting how each of them articulates specific questions, theories and methods.
