Main themes	The master's individual final project, regardless of the subject, allows a student to: • summarise a given scientific topic, • put a specific issue in context drawing on existing information, • present the results of the dissertation.

Evaluation methods	<ul> <li>Supervision and composition of the TFE jury The TFE is supervised by a promoter.</li> <li>Students must submit their subject for approval to the promoter by the date specified in the faculty calendar.</li> <li>The TFE jury is made up of two readers: the promoter and another reader appointed by the Master's jury (represented, in this appointment task, by the jury chair).</li> <li>Oral defence</li> <li>The TFE is defended orally before a jury comprising the promoter and the reader/lector. The oral examination is an opportunity for the student and the members of the jury to exchange views. Students will be informed of the practical arrangements for the oral examination no later than the first day of the session in which the TFE is registered.</li> <li>TFE assessment criteria</li> <li>The final mark takes into account</li> <li>• achievement of the objectives set;</li> <li>• the coherence and overall quality of the work carried out (relevant and well-documented synthesis of the scientific literature, quality of the methodological approach and appropriateness to the objectives, relevance and soundheass of the analysis and interpretation;</li> <li>• the correctness, quality and relevance of the written presentation;</li> <li>• the quality of the oral presentation.</li> <li>In its final mark, the promoter also takes into account the student's commitment and the regularity of the work done throughout the MES or Sorgarme as part of the TFE.</li> <li>Rules on plagiarism and the use of AI</li> <li>Throughout the TFE, students must demonstrate their perfect mastery of the rules of bibliographic referencing; at the risk of being suspected of plagiarism, they must ensure that they</li> <li>•DO NOT copy a text without inverted commas and/or without mentioning the source;</li> <li>•DO NOT reformulate or summarise an author's original idea without mentioning the source;</li> <li>•DO NOT copy a text withou presenting it as your own (even if the author of</li></ul>

Content	The final dissertation pursues the same objectives as the MA 120 dissertation, but focuses on a more limited set of issues: it should be at least 50 pages (i.e. 125,000 characters including spaces) of original, personal writing (including bibliography and notes, but excluding appendices).
