Evaluation methods	Oral exam based on written preparation.
Teaching methods	Translations are done based on previous preparation by the students. The correction of the transliteration on the blackboard emphasises the structure and composition of the phrases, as well as an analysis of the verbal forms that are encountered. A commentary on the historical or religious questions completes the grammatical analysis of the text.
Content	The course aims to deepen and enlarge the knowledge and practice of the language that was learnt in the first cycle. According to the year, the themes treated will be studied in the light of the following texts: 1. The tale of Sinuhe, the tale of the Eloquent Peasant, the teaching of Ptahhotep, Neferty, Teachings... 2. Royal or private stela, rock inscriptions, private autobiographies.
