Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Prerequisites	The course is intended for students with a good knowledge of Arabic.
Main themes	<p>The course covers the following topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Concepts of codicology;</li> <li>2. Presentation of the issues involved in the copying and transmission of Arabic texts;</li> <li>3. Presentation of different medieval and modern Arabic scripts;</li> <li>4. Practical initiation to the reading of Arabic manuscripts (reading exercises);</li> <li>5. Introduction to the methods of editing Arabic texts (theoretical and practical aspects).</li> </ol>
Learning outcomes	
Evaluation methods	Oral examination accompanied by a written assignment.
Teaching methods	Part of the course is lectured (theoretical presentations). The rest consists of practical exercises.
Content	<p>The seminar focuses on Arabic palaeography and methods of critical edition and textual criticism.</p> <p>The seminar is primarily practical: the student will learn to read medieval and modern manuscripts and to edit a medieval text critically.</p> <p>Each part of the course will consist of two phases: a first phase consisting of a theoretical lecture, and a second phase comprising practical exercises.</p>
