	 Fittingly use epistemological, methodological and editorial propositions in the framework of the Master's dissertation. 			
Evaluation methods	Students should contact their supervisors. The differences between disciplines and topics taught in LMOD imply that evaluation methods have to be adapted according to the chosen dissertation topic. Evaluation may consist in the participation to <i>a poster day</i> , the draft of a first chapter, the elaboration of a corpus and a reasoned bibliography, etc.			
Teaching methods	Students should contact their supervisors. The differences between the disciplines and topics taught in LMOD imply that the teaching methods depend on the topic of the dissertation. The supervisors may organize traditional seminars or offer one-on-one encounters with the students.			
Content	Introduction to specific methodologies according to the chosen discipline.
