	Critically discuss the legitimacy and the validity of the periodization used and write, from the perspective of literary and cultural history, a personal analysis of (a) literary text(s), based on various scientific sources,				
	Make correct and relevant use of heuristic tools, and develop the reading and writing skills needed to produce a personal scholarly work that complies with academic conventions in the field of Dutchlanguage literary studies.
