Main themes	This seminar provides students with foundations in methodology. It will provide in depth study of a precise topic using a corpus of relevant texts.
Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to use bibliographical resources and documentation; 2. to give evidence of adopting a multidisciplinary point of view; 3. to write a research question; 4. to analyse in depth French medieval texts; 5. to show critical attitude vis a vis text editions and textual variants; 6. to write an academic text.
Evaluation methods	<p>Oral presentation and writing of a personal paper. The final grade of the examination takes into account</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - participation in the seminar sessions (5%) - Oral presentation of personal work (35%) - the written work (60%). <p>The evaluation of the written work takes into account the quality of the language used. The modalities of the evaluation of the mastery of French are listed in point 2.1 of the following document.</p> <p>A student who has not participated (presence in the "course") on a regular basis (i.e. less than 75% of the hours of the activity) will be refused registration for the seminar examination in application of article 72 of the RGEE.</p> <p>Translated with www.DeepL.com/Translator (free version)</p>
