Evaluation methods	<p>The evaluation has two components:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Participation in the course through homework preparation (30%).</li> <li>2. Written exam in January: translation of a text studied in class (no working tools allowed), then of an unknown text (working tools allowed: dictionary, grammar), with some analysis of verb forms to be provided. (70% of final mark).</li> </ol> <p>At Q3, the evaluation consists only on a written exam, with the same modalities as just indicated. The use of Bible software, websites and artificial intelligence is forbidden for homework, classwork and exams.</p>
Content	<p>In-depth study of Biblical Massoretic Hebrew (poetry). The course covers the reading of biblical poetic texts, with particular attention to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) textual criticism ;</li> <li>(b) linguistic study in relation ato other Semitic languages;</li> <li>(c) the main modes of expression in Hebrew poetry;</li> <li>(d) the historical situation of the text and its place in the evolution of biblical thought.</li> </ol>
