Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • understand the general concepts of HR in a business context • communicate with corporate HR professionals around HR related matters.
Evaluation methods	<p>The exam is in writing and consists of 20 multiple choice questions and two open questions. For the multiple choice part, higher seizure is used as an alternative to standard correction for guessing.</p> <p>For Erasmus students alternative exam methods may apply when necessary to comply with the calendar of their home university.</p>
Teaching methods	<p>Oral teaching with explanation of theories and illustration through examples. Room for interactive discussions. Students must be ready to answer direct questions asked by the professor.</p> <p>No pre-course reading is expected</p>
Content	<p>The course is designed around the basic HR-scheme: inflow-transfer-outflow. Based upon this scheme we will discuss the main theories currently applied by HR professionals. The following topics will be discussed during teaching:</p> <p>General introduction – definition and evolution Job analysis and job evaluation Recruitment of candidates Selection of applicants Socialization of newcomers Performance management of employees Staff outflow</p>
