Main themes	This course explores the territorial and landscape foundations of human settlements, the evolution of city-countryside relations, and the emergence of urban issues. It examines the history of urbanization processes and territorial projects (urban, rural, and landscape) within their geographical, environmental, political, economic, and social contexts. Additionally, it delves into the theories and schools of thought in urbanism and landscape, with a particular focus on those of the 19th, 20th, and 21st centuries.
Learning outcomes	 At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to : Use reasoned arguments to situate representative urbanistic projects in time and space, Focus on the issues related to the forms and uses of open spaces, Explain the meaning of a territorial structure (urban, suburban, and rural) by contextualizing it, Analyze the impact of urban projects on the development of territories and their contexts, with a focus on sustainable development and transitions.
