Evaluation methods	<p>For the first session, assessment will take place in two parts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The first part (10 points out of 20 points, i.e. 50% of points) will consist of "continuous assessment": submission of a written assignment during the semester, with an oral presentation in class. This assessment activity will be organized individually or in groups, depending on the number of students enrolled.</li> <li>- The second part of the assessment (10 points out of 20 points, i.e. 50% of points): written examination during the session.</li> </ul> <p>For the second session (20 points): oral examination.</p>
Teaching methods	<p>Lectures presenting the theoretical material illustrated by numerous case studies and real situations.</p> <p>Active participation of students, notably through i) exercises to mobilise texts and apply relevant legal rules, ii) oral presentations of case resolution and/or analysis, and iii) group discussions.</p> <p>Students will be provided with detailed powerpoint presentations (slides) of the courses.</p>
