The structure and meaning of English words: morphemes, morphs, allomorphs; inflection and derivation; word formation processes; neologisms 4. The discourse of English: descriptive and critical discourse analysis; ecolinguistics The course unit also shows how the tools of corpus linguistics make it possible to approach these different elements.
