Evaluation methods	Formative assessment during the term. January exam session : summative assessment consisting in an assignment (paper to be handed in on the last course of the term). The detailed assignment instructions will be e-mailed and/or posted on Moodle. August/September exam session: assignment. Summative assessment: The use of generative AI is strictly forbidden.
Teaching methods	Lectures and exercise sessions. Sessions partly organized through Moodle. Individual and/or group assignments.
Content	<p>- Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - be introduced to the theory of Quality Assurance (brief overview of the QA history, ISO, European and national standards for translation services, going from proofreading to QA, etc.) and the purpose of the quality assurance process; - study different QA processes implemented in translation agencies ; - read material related to the QA process ; - prepare for the summative assessment through various exercises and/or assignments. <p>Formative feedback will be provided.</p>
