Main themes	The course will be divided into two large sections: statistics and epidemiology. Statistics: Subjects covered: descriptive statistics (variables, statistical measures, distributions), estimation (statistical measures, parameter estimation), statistical test (principles, practical use of statistical tests), introduction to regression models. Epidemiology: Subjects covered: introduction to epidemiology, measures in epidemiology, types of epidemiological studies, measures of effects and population impacts, standardisation of rates, bias evaluation, causality concept, technique performances. Learning outcomes	At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to : Using a practical approach, this course introduces students to the basics of common statistical methods and initiates them in the principles and basic methods of epidemiology. The goal being, on the one hand, to guide students in making relevant choices of statistical methods for a concrete public health or medical problem and in understanding the results and, on the other hand, to enable students to read and to include/ understand epidemiologic and statistical aspects of public health publications in a critical way.
