Evaluation methods	<p>Any overall average less than 10/20 is rounded down to the nearest whole number.</p> <p>In this course, students are assessed in two ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - a compulsory assignment (30% of the final grade) - an written examination in session (70% of the final grade). <p>In the event of a mark of less than 8/20 for one of the parts, the final mark will be the lowest mark obtained.</p>
