Learning outcomes	
Evaluation methods	<p>Oral examination with a preparation time. The student presents the first part of the exam before a teaching assistant. If the grade obtained in this first part is lower than 8/20, the exam ends at that point. If the grade obtained in this first part is equal to or higher than 8/20, the student is then examined by one of the professors.</p> <p>Students are allowed to use their <i>Code BAC</i> and their collection of supplementary texts during the exam. In both the <i>Code BAC</i> and the collection, students are permitted to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• underline or highlight words or sentences;</li> <li>• circle words (but not individual letters or groups of letters);</li> <li>• make cross-references from one article to another, accompanied, where appropriate, by the title of the corresponding legal provision.</li> </ul> <p>The use of post-its and other removable dividers is allowed, but they may only indicate the title (possibly abbreviated) and the date of the legal instruments contained on the marked page.</p>
Teaching methods	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Essentially theoretical ex cathedra lecture;</li> <li>- The teacher will be receptive to answer any questions during breaks or after sessions;</li> <li>- A tutorial (optional) of and constitutional law is organised to help students achieve the objectives set out above.</li> <li>- A PowerPoint summarizes the structure of the course, the relevant provisions, as well as the commented case law. It is available via Moodle.</li> <li>- A question and answer session is held at the end of the semester.</li> </ul>
