To be familiar with the different methodological approaches used to understand human behaviour in social situations.
Evaluation methods	<p>Assessment takes the form of a written examination.</p> <p>For Part I of the course, the examination focuses on the material covered in class and specified on the course syllabus, including the abridged bibliography in the appendix. This examination involves three structured dissertations.</p> <p>For Part II of the course, an written exam (for 20 points) on all material seen during the course (slides presented during lectures, videos seen during the lectures and texts exts discussed during the course).
