Has a fairly good command of grammar. Occasional errors and syntactic mistakes may still occur and can be corrected in retrospect. use almost the entire range of phonological features of the target language with fairly good control, so as to be almost always intelligible. articulate most of the sounds of the target language. The presence of an accent from other language(s) may be identified but does not affect comprehension.
