Content	<p><b>1. Historical and epistemological approach to clinical psychology</b> This first step will epistemologically situate the discipline "clinical psychology". It will also be a question of understanding its evolution within a changing society.</p> <p><b>2.Elements of psychoanalysis</b> This second stage of teaching will consist in transmitting to the students a theorization of the psychic apparatus as proposed by psychoanalysis. We will discuss the notions of symptom, impulse, transfer, etc.</p> <p><b>3. Notions of psychopathology</b> In a third step, it will be a question of discovering various pathologies (psychoses, neuroses, perversions).</p> <p><b>4. Criminological Clinical Issues</b> This last phase of the teaching will make it possible to integrate the three points that precede by articulating them to criminological questions (i.e. criminality of sectarian movements).</p>
