Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Main themes	The selected issues correspond to special questions of administrative law directly influenced by European law. The number of issues is limited in order to enable a deep analysis of each of them. They can also change in consideration of among others Belgian or European legal current events. The analysis may concern an issue in the sphere of public procurements law or civil service law in connection with European Union Law. It may also concern a question of civil service law or taking over a real estate for a public purpose influenced by the European Convention on Human Rights or one of its protocols. Teaching is made in classes at the rhythm of two hours a week during one semester. The teacher illustrates the course with many examples and tries to incite the active participation of the student. At this respect, he invites the student to put the newly acquired knowledge into practice in concrete situations. He also promotes critical observations regarding solutions recommended by law in force.
