Course planning in terms of communicative and linguistic objectives, tasks and genres. 3. Construction of teaching sequences and communicative and action-based lessons. 4. Transversal dimensions of the teaching-learning of French as a foreign language, including assessment and plurilingual and intercultural perspectives.
Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of this learning unit, the student is able to :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1 Understand the essential principles of foreign language teaching, and in particular the teaching of French as a foreign language. 2 Justify the choice of effective didactic approaches, methods and techniques, in a critical and reflective manner. 3 Design, prepare and apply a coherent communicative or action-based teaching sequence adapted to a given audience. 4 Recognize and adapt to different French as a foreign language teaching contexts and integrate intercultural and plurilingual components. <p>This teaching unit contributes to the development and mastery of the following skills and knowledge from the School of Languages and Arts syllabus (see ELAL AA table).</p>
Evaluation methods	<p>The final grade for the course is based on three components.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A final examination (80%) covering both theory (concepts, principles, methodologies, etc.) and teaching practice (lesson and sequence planning, in particular). The examination will be written in January; the format may be adapted for the September session. 2. Completion of preparatory readings, via collaborative annotation on the Perusall platform (10%). 3. Active participation in lectures and practical sessions, through active attendance, participation in group work or submission of interim reports on practical work (10%).
Teaching methods	<p>Interactive lectures, encouraging questions and interventions, and soliciting participation through immediate surveys (e.g., Woodclap).</p> <p>Practical work to put into practice the principles and structures studied for the development, adjustment and teaching of lessons and didactic sequences.</p> <p>Pre-reading each week to be done online, on Perusall, via Moodle. Active and collaborative reading counts towards the final assessment.</p>
