Main themes	Under the terms of Decree 2021, art. 24, §3, 'the final year's work is based on at least two of the areas of training defined in the previous paragraph, including training in and through research in education and didactics'. Paragraph 4 specifies that the final project must be 'linked to a process of action research or collaborative research'.

AA specific to the language course: • Writing the dissertation in the target language is required.
