Content	<p>The three-hour-per-week course aims to deepen students' language and linguistics skills in Italian, both written and spoken, through an integrated communicative approach that emphasizes interaction, grammatical consolidation, and lexical enrichment in exercises.</p> <p>In the theoretical component, grammar will be studied from a linguistic perspective: morphology, syntax, and pragmatics. Ongoing changes will be noted, as well as contradictions between prescriptive grammar and actual language use.</p> <p>Objectives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intermediate mastery of Italian (level B1/B2); • Ability to interact autonomously and in a structured manner in Italian; • Deepening of knowledge in linguistics; • Identifying tensions between normative grammar and the study of language in practice.
