Main themes	This teaching unit treats subjects about themes that are related to the study programme and the future professional needs of the student: sports and fysiotherapy.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use the basic vocabulary and extension of the general as well as specific (field-related) vocabulary. • understand and use the specific Dutch structures (passive voice, inversion, het voornaamwoordelijk bijwoord, "er, de bijzin, '). <p>Culture</p> <p>In the development of all the above-mentioned skills the course will aim at making the students aware of Dutch and Flemish cultural aspects.</p>
<p>Evaluation methods</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continuous assessment (summative and formative) based on the active participation in the course, a bucket list (15%), different tests (15%). • Oral exam based on an improvised dialogue and questions related to the content of the syllabus (30%). • Written exam (40%): vocabulary, listening comprehension and reading comprehension <p>If students don't take the oral and/or written exam, they will be given an "unjustified absence", even if they have taken all the other parts of the evaluation.</p> <p>Attendance at the course is compulsory. If the teacher deems it useful, he/she may ask the jury to prohibit students who have not regularly attended the learning activities to register for the exam (RGEE - art. 72).</p> <p>All parts of the assessment are compulsory. However, absence (without official justification) from a continuous assessment test will result in a "0" for that test; absence from a mid-term or written examination and/or oral examination will result in a mark of absence for the entire assessment and the student will therefore be prohibited from registering for the other parts of the assessment.</p> <p>If the student has not attended classes and therefore has not taken the various parts of the continuous assessment, they will have to retake all parts in August. Both presentations (text and business) will be individual.</p> <p>ABSENCE:</p> <p>In the event of a justified absence (e.g. due to illness), the certificate must be sent to the chair of the jury, to the faculty secretariat, with a copy to the professor and course coordinator.</p> <p>Article 103. – Any student registered for exams who is unable to attend one or more of them must notify the chair of the jury and the faculty administration of the reason for their absence without delay. No later than the day after the end of the impediment, they shall submit to the faculty administration the original supporting documents, i.e. a medical certificate or any other document whose probative value is left to the discretion of the faculty administration.</p> <p>ATTENDANCE NOTE:</p> <p>A request for an attendance note in December will result in a zero for the entire assessment; the student cannot submit it in Q2; however, they can submit the Q2 assessments.</p> <p>With regard to requests for "attendance notes", only those submitted via the student's virtual office will be considered.</p> <p>If the (health) situation does not allow for permanent evaluation (e.g. we need to switch to online and distance learning), then:</p> <p>--> The continuous assessment will be replaced by a portfolio.</p> <p>--> The written exam will take place on a platform using remote monitoring (proctoring). Taking into account the health situation, if the possibility is however left to us to organise a face-to-face written examination, we will opt for this possibility and will organise a face-to-face written examination.</p> <p>If the proctoring platform for the written examination cannot be used for any reason, the written examination will be cancelled and replaced by the oral assessment. This mark will then constitute 100% of the final mark.</p> <p>--> The oral assessment will take place on TEAMS.</p> <p>If the teacher has doubts about a student's performance in a written certification assessment, the teacher will question the student orally on the same subject in the days following the assessment in order to verify the student's competence.</p> <p>Generative artificial intelligences (AI) must be used responsibly and in accordance with academic and scientific integrity practices. Scientific integrity requires that sources be cited, and the use of AI should always be disclosed. The use of artificial intelligence for the LNE1136 tests and exams is explicitly prohibited and will be considered cheating.</p>
<p>Teaching methods</p>	<p>The UE (course) is mainly given face-to-face with e-learning support.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Revision of basic vocabulary and grammar. • Acquisition of new field-related vocabulary, concepts by means of reading exercises, oral exercises (debates, dialogues, etc.), listening exercises and vocabulary exercises. <p>Depending on the (health) situation, the course can be given in a hybrid or "comodal" way or we might possibly have to switch to online and distance learning.</p>
<p>Content</p>	<p>The teaching unit is directed at interactive communication. The provided activities are aiming at the development of communication skills needed in the professional field, in commanding the code (general and specific vocabulary and grammar), necessary for putting these skills in practice. These activities will simulate real situations in which oral skills are required.</p> <p>They will be of two types:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. presentation and activation of functions of language directly linked to professional life (social skills, telephonic communication, role-playing patient-therapist)

	2. individual and interactive speaking activities. This part includes a presentation on a subject related to the medical field.
