Evaluation methods	<p><b>Attendance at the course is compulsory.</b> If the teacher deems it useful, he/she may ask the jury to prohibit a student who has not followed the learning activities regularly to register for the course examination (RGEE - art. 72). Continuous assessment of business vocabulary in the course of the quadri. (20%)</p> <p>At the end of Q1:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• oral exam (50%) (last week of Q1)</li> <li>Written part: listening comprehension 30%</li> <li>Both exams cover the topics treated in the first quadri.</li> <li>• The examinations take place on the LLN campus if health conditions allow it.</li> </ul> <p><b>All parts of the assessment are compulsory.</b> However, absence (without official justification) from a continuous assessment test will result in a "0" for that test; absence from a mid-term or written examination and/or oral examination will result in a mark of absence for the entire assessment and the student will therefore be prohibited from registering for the other parts of the assessment.</p> <p>If the student has not attended classes and therefore has not taken the various parts of the continuous assessment, they will have to retake all parts in August. Both presentations (text and business) will be individual.</p> <p><b>ABSENCE:</b></p> <p>In the event of a justified absence (e.g. due to illness), the certificate must be sent to the chair of the jury, to the faculty secretariat, with a copy to the professor and course coordinator.</p> <p>Article 103. – Any student registered for exams who is unable to attend one or more of them must notify the chair of the jury and the faculty administration of the reason for their absence without delay. No later than the day after the end of the impediment, they shall submit to the faculty administration the original supporting documents, i.e. a medical certificate or any other document whose probative value is left to the discretion of the faculty administration.</p> <p><b>ATTENDANCE NOTE:</b></p> <p>A request for an attendance note in December will result in a zero for the entire assessment; the student cannot submit it in Q2; however, they can submit the Q2 assessments.</p> <p>With regard to requests for "attendance notes", only those submitted via the student's virtual office will be considered.</p> <p><b>Generative artificial intelligences (AI)</b> must be used responsibly and in accordance with academic and scientific integrity practices. Teaching methods	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lessons in groups of 20 students.</li> <li>• This course is given at the rate of 2 hours "live" per week.</li> <li>• <b>Note attesting to the "hours of presence"</b></li> </ul> <p><b>If circumstances (in terms of health or the possibilities offered to us by the university authorities) permit, "face-to-face hours" consist of live teaching in a room allocated by the ILV. If "live teaching" is not possible, we will switch to digital lessons through Teams where the presence of students is required.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Workload</li> </ul> <p><i>Classroom hours : 30 h</i></p> <p><i>Self-study (including e-learning): 60 h</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Extension of business and economical vocabulary. In all cases the vocabulary is presented in context.</li> <li>• Training and development of listening skills in class by means of authentic documents mainly focussing on economical and commercial topics.</li> </ul> <p>Additional exercises will have to be done at home (e-learning on the Moodle platform)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Training and development of speaking skills in a professional context. (the debate, the negotiation, the business meeting, the presentation, the job interview etc. ) by means of classroom teaching .</li> </ul> <p>Additional exercises will have to be done at home (e-learning on the Moodle platform).</p>
Content	<p>This teaching unit consists of</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• confronting the students with different kinds of audio and video fragments (monologues, dialogues, formal/informal register, different accents) in order to improve the level of the listening comprehension</li> <li>• improving their speaking skills (particularly in a business environment) through a variety of oral exercises.</li> <li>• Confronting the students with the world of business and business communication.</li> </ul>
