Content	<p>In this course, we will look at migration issues from a gender perspective/gender issues from a migration perspective. To this end, the course will be structured as follows:</p> <p>The first part will serve as an introduction to both migration phenomena (definition, measurement, evolutions, characteristics of male and female migration; transnational turn and the reciprocal influences between societies of origin and host societies) and to gender approaches to migration (genesis and main theoretical perspectives).</p> <p>The second part will address more specific themes related to the migration issue from a gender perspective. The non-exhaustive list of themes that may be addressed in this course includes: the impact of colonisation/ decolonisation and globalisation; the transnational turn; the question of care and sexuality; the interconnections between gender, migration and the labour market; the intersecting effects of gender and migratory status; and the question of resistance in a migratory context.</p>
